#### 4. First-aid measures

<b>Inhalation</b>	If breathing is difficult, remove to fresh air and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. Get medical attention if symptoms persist.

Do not allow material to contaminate ground water system.</p> <p>Small Spills: Wipe up with absorbent material (e.g. cloth, fleece).</p> <p>Large Spills: Dike far ahead of spill for later disposal. Use a non-combustible material like vermiculite, sand or earth to soak up the product and place into a container for later disposal.</p> <p>Never return spills to original containers for re-use. Following product recovery, flush area with water. This material and its container must be disposed of as hazardous waste. Clean up in accordance with all applicable regulations.</p>
